From where I come, major problem was limited availability of irrigation resources hence, we were not able to utilize all land for cultivation. It is so difficult to use new technologies like drip irrigation and fertigation in scattered and small land holdings.

The farmers are practising traditional cropping methods and they are not accepting other crops like vegetable crops for cultivation. Perhaps because quality seeds are not available in our local area for these vegetable crops. In vegetable crops, there's lack of knowledge about nutrition management, disease and pest control, cost of managing and marketplace for sale of produce. Hence, they are not able to accept these crops in regular practices. Having proper knowledge, now I can guide them for these cultivation practices. With this in mind, I decided to enter into this field so that I could contribute in providing them better quality seeds with affordable price.

During my childhood, the irrigation systems were not good and the crop cultivation was heavily dependent on monsoons. The availability of good seeds was limited, and people used domestic seeds. At times, when there was no seed left in the house due to drought, seeds were then arranged from relatives' place. Irrespective of the kind of nursery was planted, farmers had to plant the same seed in the field. There was neither any solution nor availability of any other seed that could be planted quickly. The primary bottleneck in farming was scale. On an average, 5-8 acres of land per family was further divided into 15 to 20 pieces, as a result it was not possible to plant any crop on a large scale. It was also hard to manage and guard. Amidst all these circumstances, as I grew up, I realized that improvement in farmers' standard of living is possible only when they have good knowledge of seeds as well as the know-how of cultivating other crops. When I got a chance to work in this field, I accepted with a great pleasure. Since then, whenever I am amongst the farmers and share some new information with them, I feel happy and proud that I work for the happiness of the food provider who feeds and nurtures the whole world.

What is Mulching & Why is it Useful?



VNR is well known for the best quality products in the market owing to the best practices it follows. Keeping up to VNR's efforts of imparting knowledge to all stakeholders, Mr. Randip Ghosh (VNR Nursery) discusses the intriguing and very useful technique called 'Mulching' along with some of the most frequently asked questions by Agri-participants.

Q. What is Mulch?

Mulch is a protective layer of material that is spread on top of the soil. Mulches can be either organic - such as grass clippings, straws, bark chips and similar materials, or, inorganic - such as stones, brick chips and plastics.

Q. Why to do mulching?

- Mulching retains soil's moisture.
- Reduces the growth of weeds.
- Improves soil's health.
- Regulates soil's temperature.

Q. What are the different types of mulch?

- Organic mulches– paddy straw, maize straw
- Inorganic – plastic, rubber

Q. How to choose between organic and plastic mulch?

If the area is hot prone (above 45°C), then organic mulch will perform better as it reduces the soil's temperature. If the temperature of area is less than 42°C then plastic mulch can be chosen.

Q. What are the advantages of mulching and how it helps in better plant growth?

Mulches have advantages like conservation of soil moisture, maintaining soil temperature and hindering weeds' growth, so mulches are of a great advantage throughout the cultivation. However, season specific uses of mulch can add advantage in various way. Organic mulches add on benefit during summer when the irrigation water is scarce. Mulch gets readily decomposed during the following monsoon adding up to the organic manure, enriching the soil and maintaining soil temperature during winters. Different colour mulches have different benefits, for e.g. if one is doing plantations during summer or monsoon then it is better to use white-black mulch with white on top, while during winters one

should use sliver on black mulch with silver on top (mostly for sub-tropical regions – N. Indian conditions).

Q. What is the role of drip irrigation in mulching?

In areas with high weed intensity, drip along with plastic mulch (PM) can be adopted. This treatment results in reduction of weed infestation, higher yield and saving in irrigation water when compared with the surface flood without mulch treatment.

Q. What are the various thicknesses of plastic mulch and what is the right size to use in a fruit orchard?

Usually the area covered by mulch should be perpendicular to that of canopy of a plant or the size of the bed. The thickness however, in case of organic mulch in a fruit orchard should be around 20-30cm. On the other hand a plastic mulch comes in thickness starting from 25 microns to 100 microns. We opt for 100 microns plastic mulch in a fruit orchard so it can last long i.e. for at least 3years covering the entire bed area of the plantation. As the bed area is also a working zone, so the thickness of inorganic mulch provides longer shelf life.

Q. Can I use organic mulch in fruit orchards? What are its advantages?

Yes, organic mulch can be used in fruit orchards. As the bed area is also a working zone, so the thickness of organic mulch should be around 20-30 cm.

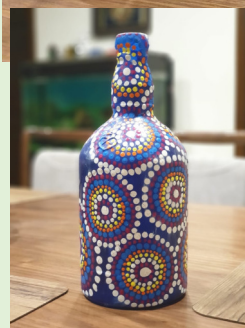
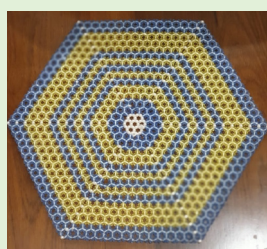
Following are its advantages:

- Conserving soil moisture so plants experience less wet/dry cycling stress.
- Reducing energy use associated with irrigation by reducing evaporation.
- Moderating soil temperature through shading.
- Providing erosion control by reducing the energy generated by raindrop impact and subsequent soil detachment.
- Suppressing weed growth through shading.
- Facilitating the establishment of vegetative cover by holding soil moisture, reducing erosion, loss of seeds or seedlings and suppressing weed growth.
- Improving soil quality by adding organic matter.
- Reducing airborne particulates by reducing wind erosion.

Traveling - To be or Not to be?

It must've been about an year for the travel itineraries resting peacefully inside your wish list diary. Well almost, and especially true if you had a plan in the beginning of 2020. While the phenomenon of second wave is real and has hit major countries in Europe resulting back in lockdown, good news for India is that the figures are falling day after day and situation is slowly re-instating back to normal. Perhaps you might be eager to give that 2020 itinerary another chance. Before that, here are some quick tips that'll keep your trip safe and secure.

Who Should Not Travel?

The mortality rate has been found high mostly in patients with chronic conditions i.e. if there's a history of a medical condition then it'll be wise not to take any risk for a leisure travel escapade. Also, senior citizens must avoid the travel as this age group has shown the highest fatality rate in India. Certainly, it's not a good time to consider any leisure travel plans even if there are measures one can take during the journey.

How to select a destination?

Preceding all checks that one usually does for planning a travel, there are few additional steps you might like to take. Check for the spread of infection at the destination in last 7 days to have a fair idea of risk. Check if there are any administrative restrictions in the place like wearing mask, quarantine or in the likes of the same. Surf state, territorial, tribal and local health web portals and print all the essential phone numbers of active COVID centers, quarantine centers, online doctor consultancy in the local and emergency help numbers. If I were you, I would've started following and communicating with some Instagram and Facebook accounts of local famous handles well in advance who share real-time updates about the city's situation and can be reached via DMs (direct messages).

What to Pack Up?

Everything usual plus your new masks collection in your carry-on luggage. Additionally, a must have bottle of 60% alcohol-based sanitizer shall be handy to safeguard from surface contamination. Additionally, it'll not be a bad idea to have your own bedsheet, pillow covers and towels which shall serve to unforeseen emergency.

How to Travel?

Make your journey as personal as it can be, social is a no go this year. If your destination is reachable via roadways, nothing like it. You need to keep enough food for the way or might as well look for self-pick service from restaurants on the way, many apps are offering such service now a days. But what if you must take flight or a train? Here's the formula:

Must have Face Mask

This formula will apply to all interactions which involves people apart from you and your family. Keep mask covering your nose and mouth. Maintain 6ft distance, how much is that? Just a little less than regular selfie-stick. Self hygiene is about keeping oneself aware and clean all the time. This mean regular hand wash, face wash, use of precaution while giving or taking something from strangers. It also involves being aware of your surrounding and taking wise decision on the basis of it. Disinfect surfaces where you think you'll have to rest. This can be the elbow rest of the cab you're on or it can be someone else's pen while signing the bill etc. If you doubt that any of these precautions are not met or not being followed, consider delaying the travel plan. It'll not be a safe journey thereafter.

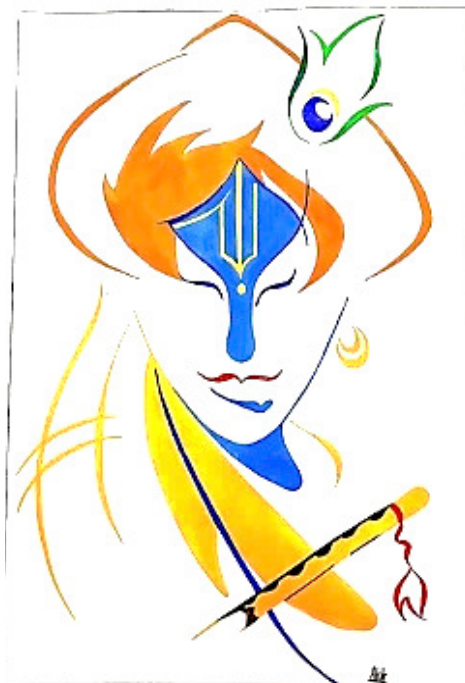
How to Stay and use much awaited Itinerary?

You've packed all the essentials. Make use of extra bedsheet and the pillow covers you've bagged when needed. Use personalized travel options for local commute. If your travel involves visiting sites such as museums, planetarium or similar closed structures, then make use of contacts you've made on social accounts or the hotel manager about the crowded hours. Discuss if your itinerary's worth a try or it needs to be shuffled based on peak hours rush etc. Make sure that you've got everything to practice the *formula* correctly.

Don't hesitate to manage the situation if you find yourself amid low disciplined crowd. After all they're too looking for someone who can guide the flock appropriately. But if you sense non-cooperation, softly step back to enjoy other pleasurable moments you've planned for the journey.

Had a Great Trip?

This sounds just great! For the next couple of days let's say 14 days, try not to come in close contact with elders and the children in the house. Also keep a close watch on the health for which one can use a thermometer to check for fever and an oximeter to check blood oxygen saturation. A test that one can easily take in home is 6 Min walk test, using oximeter. For this, start by taking first reading of oxygen saturation. After that, walk for about 6 minutes with normal speed i.e. not too slow or not too fast, just the usual walk. Post 6 mins take second reading. If you see there's a noticeable difference between first and the second read (more than 20 points drop), then it may call for a medical attention. Also, if there comes a doubt, don't hesitate to visit the nearest medical center for further help. Otherwise, congratulations! You just had a great trip.
