CHOCO BISCUIT DESERT FOR KIDS

When it comes to enjoying her favourite TV show after dinner, Vanshika, my daughter likes to savour something sweet to add to the delight. She dished out this desert using her own imagination before she was going to watch the 'Dance India Dance' episode. I was quite amazed by the combination and dressing used with simple ingredients that are always available at home. Also, it is safe as it is fireless cooking and it tastes delicious! Well, the all time kids favourite things go into the making of this dish.....which I have named as the

"Choco Biscuit Dessert".

Ingredients (As used in this recipe):

- Thin milk biscuits (12-15 Nos.)
- Chocolate sauce (Add according to taste)
- · Handful of Chocos

Procedure

- 1. Arrange about 9-10 biscuits in a circular shape on a plate. The biscuits used here are Milk Thinz by Bisk Farm.
- 2. Pour chocolate sauce over it.
- 3. Place some chocos on the biscuits.
- 4. Coarsely crush the a few biscuits using hands.
- 5. Spread crushed biscuit crumbs as a garnishing on the biscuits.
- 6. Put the dish in fridge, if you want it to be consumed much later.
- Put it in freezer for half an hour, for immediate consumption.
- 7. Remove the choco biscuit dessert from fridge and enjoy.

This is a very easy, simple and safe dessert dish for kids to try!

Many different variations can be done using crushed chocolates,
choco chips, Nutella, wafer biscuits, ice cream, etc. So kids.....do try it out!

करेला प्याज की ''बेसन वाली सब्जी''

Ingredients

बंसन - 1 कटोरी सरसों - 1 / 4 चम्मच
3 प्याज - लंबें कटे धानिया - 1 / 4 चम्मच
3 करेंले - बारीक कंटें (उबले) गरम मासला - 1 / 4 चम्मच
खड़ा धानिया पावडर -1 / 2 चम्मच नीबूं रस -2 चम्मच
सौप - 1 / 4 चम्मच षक्कर -1 / 4 चम्मच
जीरा - 1 / 4 चम्मच हल्दी, नमक, स्वादानुसार

Method: - Non. Stick pan में तेल को गरम करके सौफ, खड़ा, धिनया, जीरा, सरसों का तड़का लगायें फिर उबले करेले और कटे प्याज को उसमें डाले, फिर हल्का भूरा होने के बाद उसमें बेसन डालें, हल्का नमक, हल्दी, शक्कर, गरम मसाला, धिनया पावडर डालकर अच्छे से मिलाये और मसाला तैयार होने तक भूने बीच बीच में पानी का छीटा दे जिससे मसाला न जले गुलाबी होने पर गैस बंद कर देंगें।

TRAINING PROGRAM ON GRAFTED VEGETABLE TECHNOLOGY @ VNR R&D CENTRE, GOMCHI, RAIPUR (CHHATTISGARH)

Grafting vegetables can protect crops against many soil-borne diseases and can improve crop tolerance. VNR Nursery has developed effective grafting techniques for Brinjal, Tomato, Chili, and a few Cucurbits. Vegetable grafting is widely practiced amongst farmers in Taiwan, Japan, Korea and Vietnam. There are abundant business opportunities that will help expand this method in India. VNR Nursery has designed a unique training-cum-hands-on workshop program on grafted vegetable technology to train progressive agriculturists on this very modern business opportunity. This program is based on the concept of Listening is Knowing & Learning by Doing. VNR Nursery's prime focus is to develop a business model for profitability and welfare of the farming community. The training program modules are structured to make the participants learn grafted vegetable technology through classroom sessions and practicing grafting in green houses. 
